- 1) Write your name!
- 2) What is philosophy?
- 3) List all the philosophers you can. If you can, give their names (first and last), the century they lived in, the country they lived in, whether they thought the Mind or the World is more real, and if you can, one sentence regarding what you think is interesting about them.
- 4) What question did you investigate?
- 5) What are questions that your fellow students investigated?
- 6) What question did you ask people to collect real life examples?
- 7) Explain and discuss the difference between a person telling their opinion and a person giving an example from their life. You can discuss answers that people gave you.
- 8) How did you group the real life examples that you collected?
- 9) Draw a picture or diagram to show how you structured the groups of examples. Explain what you have drawn.
- 10) Name a philosopher and a work they wrote which you studied. Which of their ideas interested you? What ideas did you get for your investigation?
- 11) What are the main conclusions that you found?
- 12) Overview your entire investigation, how you sought an answer to your question, and what makes your conclusions valid.
